READING ROOM NOW OPEN TO RESEARCHERS

The Reading Room of the Washington County Archives is now officially open to individuals interested in conducting research in the archives' holdings of historic county records. Public hours began Monday, April 17th, 2017. The Archives is free and open to the public.

Current hours available to the public for research are: Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays (8:00 a.m.-12 noon) and Tuesdays and Thursdays (1:00 p.m.-4:30 p.m.). Reference staff is available to help those researching family, local, and regional history.

Washington County's public records date to the early 1770s and are the oldest such records in the state of Tennessee. Among the offices whose records are currently available to researchers are Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master (Chancery Court), County Clerk, and the Superior Court of Law and Equity.
