**Access Note:** The papers are available for research use. Copyright and all literary rights in the collection were retained by Ned L. Irwin, the donor and creator.

**Biographical Note:** George Lafayette Carter was born on the family farm outside Hillsville, Virginia, January 10<sup>th</sup>, 1857. He began his business career clerking in Early Johnson's store in town. Johnson's son, J. Fred Johnson, would later marry Carter's sister and work closely in his business enterprises for many years. From 1878-1889, Carter worked at and helped manage the Wythe Lead and Zinc Mine Company in Austinville, Va. He then went to work in Pulaski, Va., for a decade managing the Pulaski Development Company and the Dora Furnace. In 1898, he founded the Carter Coal and Iron Company, which evolved into the Virginia Iron, Coal and Coke Company, one of the largest industrial enterprises in the southern United States. In 1902, Carter began the development of a railroad that eventually became the Carolina, Clinchfield and Ohio Railway, the costliest railroad per mile built in America. Carter also had a major role in developing cities throughout the southern Appalachian region, including Johnson City, Kingsport, Bristol, and Erwin, Tenn. He donated the land that secured the establishment of what became East Tennessee State University. In 1913, Carter founded the Carter Coal Company in West Virginia that became the largest privately-owned coal operation in the country. Carter died on December 30<sup>th</sup>, 1936 in Washington, D. C., and was buried in his hometown of Hillsville. It has been stated that Carter did more than any other single individual to bring the industrial age to the Southern Appalachian region. **Scope and Content Note:** The collection consists of the research files and book manuscripts used by Ray Stahl and Ned L. Irwin for their biography of Appalachian industrialist George L. Carter titled *The Last Empire Builder: A Life of George L. Carter, 1857-1936* (Johnson City, Tenn.: East Tennessee State University, 2012). Documents include correspondence, articles, research notes, newspaper clippings, publications, interview transcripts and recordings, drafts of the book manuscript, and photographs.
