**Biographical Note:** J. D. (Jefferson Davis) Campbell was born in Washington County, Tenn., in 1862 and lived most of his life there and also in Greene County, Tenn. He attended medical school at the University of Louisville in Kentucky. Returning to Washington County, he practiced medicine, farmed, and raised a family. He and his wife Louise Truan (born in Knox County, Tenn.) married in September 1893 and went on to have five children. In 1902, the family moved to Yakima County, Washington seeking a better life, but returned to Greene County, Tenn., a few years later. Campbell died on July 10, 1940 and is buried at Oak Grove Cemetery in Greenville, Tenn. For more details on Campbell and the Campbell family, see the J. D. **Scope and Content Note:** The collection consists of a family *Bible*, photographs, a postcard, articles, membership cards, alumni records, legal documents, speeches, and correspondence involving the Campbell family, primarily J. D. Campbell. The items in this collection begin sometime around the 1840s and end in 1979.
