

Judicial Court Case 1779: Houghton, Joshua, Sr. vs. Andrew Greer



State of North Carolina

Joshua Houghton Sen^r complains of Andrew Greer Esq. of the County of Washington and State aforesaid, In cusday [custody] of the Sheriff for that on the day of in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy six; the aforesaid Andrew Greer by his agent and Deputy Commosary, Luke Boyer, for the Troops then stationed at Wataugah in the District of Washington did then and there borrow and Receive from the aforesaid Joshua Houghton thirty two Bushells of sound Indian Corn now worth forty five Dollars p.^r [per] Bushell which corn the aforesaid Andrew Greer has often Requested to pay, but still Refusing to the Damage of the said Joshua Houghton the sum of five hundred and seventy six pounds coien [coin] and money of said State and therefore he brings suit.
