Jacob Hunter maketh oath
that a certain Isaac Phipps of this
County is old and infirm and unable
to support himself by manual labor
that he has been a Soldier during the
Revolutionary War so he has reason
to believe that he this deponent has
seen a regular discharge that he has
from the Army and that said Isaac
informed this deponent that he had been
wounded in the late war and that
the said Isaac is at this time unable
frequently to take common sustenance

4th August 1812

allowed thirty dollars for maintaining Isaac Phipps for
his services from this session of the court

August term 1812 as decreed (decreed) that Jacob Hunter Esq be allowed thirty dollars for maintaining Isaah Phipps for the year commencing from this session of the court
